GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Dress – Jackets only

Substitutions:

Application for substitutions must be made on the form provided at the secretary's office not later than 30 minutes before the commencement of the competition concerned or as per the discipline rules. The new rider must sign the substitution forms, indicating that he has the consent of the competitor originally entered.

Entries bought or sold: Must be handed in to the show office by 12 noon the day before the class – <http://sashowjumping.co.za/uploads/province/SASJ%20Bought%20Entry%20Form%20%282%29.pdf>

Feed & Bedding:

Initial wood shavings bedding will be supplied, thereafter bedding can be purchased at the Show office. Food can be ordered from feed companies.

Grooms Facilities:

No groom's accommodation is available. Competitors are advised to provide their groom with suitable accommodation (tents etc.) Ablution facilities, with hot water, will be provided. Meals will be available for the duration of the show from .

No tents are allowed to be erected in the stable block perimeter.

Cancellation and combination of classes:

In the event of unforeseen circumstances, the organizing committee, in conjunction with the discipline representatives, reserves the right to cancel or combine classes and restrict entries (other than those applicable to championships and their qualifying classes) to a practical number. Entry fees will be refunded for any entries not accepted.

Variation of programme:

The programme will be adhered to as far as possible. The organizing committee in conjunction with the discipline representative reserves the right to make alterations in the event of insufficient or excessive entries, unfavourable weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

Competitor Obligations:

- Athletes are obliged to ride in all competitions for which they have qualified, unless they have been granted dispensation by the discipline Rep. This will normally only be given where a medical or veterinary certificate certifying that the rider or horse is unfit to compete, is produced for the competition concerned.- Prize-winners should be mounted when receiving their awards and both horse and rider must be properly dressed and turned out.
- No blankets may be worn in the competition arenas unless permission is given by the show convenors.
- Failure to co-operate and comply with these obligations may result in the forfeiting of all prize-money, rosettes, trophies and/or grading points for that athlete, unless permission is given by the discipline Rep.

Exercising of Horses and Ponies- At no time during the event may horses be exercised in the competition arenas. Only designated, officially supervised warm up arenas may be used.

Responsibility for damage, loss or injury:

The Sponsors, SAEF, SASJ, Maple Ridge and their officials shall in no way be responsible for any damage, loss or injury sustained by owners, competitors and members of the public or any other persons or their property whatsoever.

Dogs:

All dogs must be kept on leads at all times on the show grounds.

Protest & Appeals:

SASJ – R750 as per SASJ Regulations

Classes will be run at 350 mpm unless conditions necessitate a change 0.70cm, 0.80cm & 0.90cm @ 300 mpm & 1.00m classes will be run at 325 mpm. All classes will be run under SASJ Jumping Rules and those applying to the Junior/young rider South African Championship.

The Organising Committee reserves the right to restrict entries for the jumping classes to a workable maximum. No rider may ride more than two horses in the 2014 South African Junior/Young Rider Championships of S A.



CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The South African Equestrian Federation (SAEF) expects all those involved in National Equestrian sport to adhere to SAEF's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the pony/horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition ponies/horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farrier and tack, and transportation.
2. Ponies and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice pony/horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the pony/horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that ponies receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. SAEF urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

REGULATIONS and NOTES:

1. All Show Jumping will be run under FEI Jumping Regulations and SASJ Regulations. FEI Veterinary rules will be applicable with the SASJ MCP Testing and NHA Laboratory. By entering on the SASJ online system riders, guardians and parents accept the regulations and process of SASJ for MCP Testing.
2. It is the Athletes/Owners responsibility to ensure that they comply with the control measures of African Horse Sickness and Equine Flu. The batch numbers and dates of the last two vaccinations against Equine Flu and AHS must be stated in the Horses passport – these must comply with the vaccinations on the horses SASJ profile. Should these vaccinations not comply the Athlete will be issued with a fine.
3. All Athletes should be aware of the South African Drug Free Sport and WADA regulations and prohibited substances – all these are available on : <http://www.drugfreesport.org.za>
4. All Athletes are also to ensure they are aware of the Equine Anti Doping and Medication Control Programme. All information and the current FEI Equine Prohibited Substances list of Banned Substances and Controlled Medications are available on the FEI Clean Sport Website as a PDF document, Database or smart phone app.

Horse Inspection: Thursday 15th September 7.00 am - (All 1.30 and 1.35 Horses -)

5. Equine Influenza and African Horse Sickness

All horses must have been vaccinated against Equine influenza according to SAEF regulations. Vaccinations are valid for six months and must be renewed prior to expiry; otherwise primary and secondary vaccinations will have to be re-administered. All horses travelling to the AHS surveillance area / Free zone must apply according to the SOP for entering into the Controlled area prior to the commencement of the return journey. A Permit must be issued by the State Veterinarian and be accompanied by a valid health certificate (in the passport) signed by a Private Veterinarian, not more than 48 hours prior to travelling. All horses and ponies must have been vaccinated by a VETERINARIAN against African Horse Sickness using a registered polyvalent African Horse Sickness vaccine as prescribed by the manufacturer and in accordance with SAEF Veterinary rules.

All horses and ponies must be in possession of and be accompanied by a SAEF or FEI Group IX passport.

Details of all vaccinations must be entered in the passport.

A random check of passports will be conducted to ensure that they comply. Competitors not complying with the above will be fined and may be refused entry onto the grounds. No entries will be accepted without the relevant AHS and flu vac details stamped in the passport

No flu vaccination may be administered within 7 days of arriving at the show grounds.

“National Young Riders Showjumping Championship Rules”

1 COMPETITIONS PRIOR TO THE CHAMPIONSHIP

The Organising Committee shall include in the schedule a welcome stakes competition for Open horses. This competition shall not be related to the Championship or be treated as a qualifying competition for the Championship Class.

2 COMPETITIONS RELATED TO THE CHAMPIONSHIP

1 There shall be two qualifying classes and one championship class for which competitors must qualify.

2 Prize money and other awards shall be awarded as for a Recognised Competition at the conclusion of each of the three classes.

3 QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS

1. First Qualifying Competition

1. This competition shall be run in accordance with FEI Art 238.2.1 (A2 Competition). Speed 350mpm.

2. The course shall consist of between ten and twelve numbered obstacles.

2. Second Qualifying Competition

1. This competition shall be run in accordance with FEI Art 238.2.2. (AM5 Competition). Speed 350pm.

2. The course shall consist of between ten and twelve numbered obstacles and shall include only one double combination and one treble combination. If possible the course should include a water jump.

4 THE CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS

1. This competition shall be run over two rounds of a Championship course of International standard and in accordance with FEI Art 238.3.4.2, FEI Art 273.4.4, FEI Art 273.2.1. Speed at 375mpm. Speed may be adjusted by the President of Ground Jury in conjunction with the Course Designer to suit the arena size but may never be less than 350mpm.

2. The course will consist of between ten and twelve numbered obstacles and shall include either one double and one treble combination or three double combinations. If possible a water jump should be included in the course but may only be included if it was included in one of the qualifying competitions.

3 The dimensions of the fences in the course may be altered for the second round at the sole discretion of the Course Designer.

**TURNIERSTALL HILMAR MEYER
JUNIOR AND YOUNG RIDER
SHOWJUMPING SERIES 2016**

1 THE SERIES

The Turnierstall Hilmar Meyer Young Rider Showjumping Series will comprise three competitions held during a calendar year.

The classes will be:

Leg 1: President's Cup – Leg 1- Maple Ridge Equestrian Farm

Leg 2: Kyalami Park

Leg 3: Maple Ridge Youth Extravaganza incorporating the final of the **Turnierstall Hilmar Meyer Series**.

All three classes in the series together with their preliminary classes will carry CSN Status and will be judged under Table A.

2 QUALIFICATION OF RIDERS

The Series is restricted to Junior and Young Riders (Juniors 14 - 18 and Young Riders 16 - 21)

Juniors = from the beginning of the Calendar year in which the rider turns 14 to the end of the calendar year in which the rider turns 18.

Young Riders = from the beginning of the Calendar year in which the rider turns 16 to the end of the calendar year in which the rider turns 21.

3 QUALIFICATION OF HORSES

Open to horses.

4 PRELIMINARY COMPETITIONS PRIOR TO EACH SERIES COMPETITION

4.1 At each event the Organising Committee shall include in the schedule at least one preliminary competition for Open horses at 1,30m or 1,35m, competing separately.

It is advisable to include the water jump if it is used in the final Turnierstall Hilmar Meyer event.

4.2 In order to qualify to compete in a series competition, all competitors must have completed a minimum of 2 out of the 3 Legs of the series – all points will count towards the final score.

5 ORDER OF STARTING

5.1 The order of starting in the three series competitions shall be drawn.

5.2 Where possible, a gap of at least seven horses shall be allowed between horses ridden by the same rider. This shall be achieved by moving that rider's first horse drawn upwards in the order of riding.

5.3 Should a rider have more than one horse entered in any of the series competitions, then that rider shall declare, prior to the commencement of the class, which horse will be going for series points, and that horse must be ridden first.

6 THE SERIES COMPETITIONS

6.1 **LEG 1 -Turnierstall Hilmar Meyer 1st Leg Competition** FEI 238.2.2

6.2 **LEG 2 - Turnierstall Hilmar Meyer 2nd Leg Competition** FEI 238.2.2

6.3 **LEG 3 Turnierstall Hilmar Meyer Final Leg Competition** FEI 238.2.2

6.4 Rules

All series competitions will be run over Championship courses of National Standard (1,30m with some fences at 1.35m) run at a speed of 350 mpm.

Preliminary classes at each event will be run at a speed of 350mpm, or the speed of the relevant competitions at the show.

7 ELIGIBILITY

All competitions are open to all Juniors and Young Riders qualified to compete in Open Classes.

8 POINTS

Points will be awarded to riders in accordance with the FEI World Cup Qualification points system as set out in 10 below.

9 CLASSIFICATION

Should there be a tie for first place overall after the third competition, the highest placed competitor in the final competition will be declared the Series Winner.
