CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

PRIZEMONEY:

A minimum of 60% net of entry fees excluding levies and VAT for CSN classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies and VAT Provincial classes plus sponsorship per class. All CSN Jumping classes will be subject to a 15% deduction from prize money to be paid into the SASJ Riders Fund.

Distribution will be one prize for every four entries.

Prize Money that is paid out in cash at the event is the riders responsibility to collect at the judges box if they miss the prize giving.

SUBSTITUTIONS:

A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider.

For provincial classes with <u>Composite entry fee</u>, should a horse need to be substituted it may be substituted ONCE per entry only (if a composite entry of 4 classes, only ONE change may be done). Should a rider need to be substituted and the entry consists of a composite entry of 4 classes, the rider may be changed more than once. All substitutions must be given to the show holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties, a minimum of 30 minutes before the start of the relevant class.

For National classes a substitution may only take place ONCE, before the horse inspection. Should there be NO horse inspection, a substitution may only take place ONCE, by midday on the day before the National classes start, thereafter, <u>NO</u> substitutions will be permitted. All substitutions must be given to the Show Holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties.

DRESS: Jackets Only

STABLING: R1200 for the duration of the show

Initial bedding is included. Additional bedding will be available at the show office for the competitors own account.

ALL COMPETITORS needing stabling MUST COMPLETE the STABLE BOOKING FORM / Or book on the SASJ System by closing date of entries.

VIP MARQUEE: R5000 for a table of 10 or R550 for individual seats.

GROOMS MEALS: R1000 for the duration of the show

ACCESS: All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

ACCREDITATION: N/A

PASSPORTS: All horses must be in possession of their FEI Passports or Group IX Passports at all shows.

Inspections, sampling and random passport checks, may take place at any event. All horses competing in FEI Classes must have FEI passports or FEI Recognition cards and must be registered with the FEI for 2019 Horse Registrations.

AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS

1 African Horse Sickness (AHS)

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa; therefore, any suspicion of a clinical case of AHS anywhere in the country must be reported to the local State Veterinarian immediately.

Symptoms of AHS include high temperature, rapid breathing, coughing followed by a frothy fluid from the nostrils and death within a few hours. In less acute cases, swelling of the neck and head particularly above the eyes and redness of the mucous membranes.

1 African Horse Sickness Zones

The Republic of South Africa has been divided into four zones, namely:

- 1 AHS Free Zone
- 2 AHS Surveillance Zone
- 3 AHS Protection Zone
- 4 AHS Infected Zone.

All Equines in South Africa except in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones are required to be vaccinated against AHS annually, with an effective remedy registered in section 1, of Act 101 of 1965.

Equines residing in the AHS Free and AHS Surveillance Zones require permission from the State Directorate for vaccination against AHS.

All equines residing in the AHS Protection and Infected Zones must be vaccinated annually against AHS.

In the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zone vaccination is only allowed between 1st June and 31st October of each year.

Whilst it is not a requirement that horses in the AHS Infected Zone be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st October it has been strongly recommended. Therefore, the SAEF AHS Vaccination Requirements are as follows:

- 1 All Equines competing in SAEF events are required to have an annual AHS vaccine with a vaccine registered under Act 101 of 1965. The vaccine consists of AHS 1 and AHS 2. The vaccine has to be administered by a registered Veterinarian, registered with the South African Veterinary Council with a minimum period of 21 days between the two vaccines.
- 2 The Vaccine and batch number must be written in the appropriate vaccination page and signed and stamped by the Veterinarian administering the vaccine.
- 3 Horses residing in the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zones may only be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st of October each year.
- 4 Horses that reside in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones and participate in events in these Zones only are exempt from the necessity of annual AHS vaccination. However, if they wish to compete in the AHS Protection or AHS Infected Zones, they must be vaccinated.
- AHS vaccinations that are given with an interval of less than the minimum 21 days are null and void for both vaccinations and horses that have received such vaccinations will be deemed not to have been vaccinated.

 No horse may compete for 7 days following any vaccination.

Equine Influenza (EI)

- 1. All Horses participating in SAEF Events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza
- 2. An initial Primary Course of two vaccinations must be given; the second vaccination must be administered within 21-92 days of the first vaccination.

In completing the primary course of the vaccinations, the vaccine must be the same manufacturer for example you initially vaccinate with Proteq the second must be the same.

3. The First Booster must be given within 7 calendar months following the date of administration of the second vaccination of the primary Course.

All horses that were certified as correctly receiving the Primary Course prior to 1 January 2005 (under previous regulations), are not required to fulfill the requirement for the First Booster, providing there has been no lapse in their vaccination regime.

- 4. Booster Vaccinations
- a) The minimum booster frequency is every 12 months.
- b) However, for Horses competing, the last Booster must have been given within 6 months +21 days (and not within 7 days) before arrival at the Event.

Rules, Regulations, Terms and Conditions applicable to all FEI, National & Provincial Classes

- 1. Competition Classes All classes will be run under the applicable FEI Rule unless otherwise stated a deviation to the SASJ Rule.
- 2. It is the Athletes/Owners responsibility to ensure that they comply with the control measures of African Horse Sickness and Equine Flu. Batch Numbers and dates of the last two vaccinations against Equine Influenza and AHS must be stated in the passport and signed and stamped by a registered veterinarian.
- 3. Vaccinations and Micro Chip Numbers must correspond with the information loaded on the SASJ Online System
- 4. Protests lodged must adhere to the General Regulations and SASJ Rules.
- 5. Registration of Horse/Pony and Rider with their Club, SASJ and SAEF must be in order on the SASJ Database.
- 6. All Athletes and Owners should be aware of the FEI Equine Prohibited Substances list of banned Substances and Controlled Medication as well South African Drug Free Sport and WADA Regulations and prohibited substances All available on the various websites.
- 7. SASJ TAG Heuer Timing Equipment CP540 is required for all National and FEI Events and is the responsibility of the <u>OC</u> to organize, collect and return the equipment.
- 8. Athletes are to ensure that any sponsored Saddlecloths or Athlete Wear they compete in during the event that the Sponsors are registered with SASJ for the current year.
 - Athletes are also to ensure their logos comply with the FEI Sizes for Advertising Article 256
- 9. Athletes are to ensure they are registered with a club, SASJ and SAEF.
- 10. PARADES Except in circumstances where special dispensation has been obtained from the Show Director, competitors must take part in any parade or display or Prize giving. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of any Prize money, Grading/Qualification Points and/or Trophies.
- 11. The organising committee in consultation with the SASJ Representative reserves the right to combine, handicap, divide or cancel classes should this be necessary, always provided such amendments are not in conflict with the rules. Where necessary, classes may be restricted to qualifications. 80% of entry fees will be refunded should the classes be cancelled due to inclement weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
- 12. The FEI, SASJ, SAEF, KPC, SANEC and any sponsors, the Organising Committee any and/or Officials shall in no way be held responsible for any damage, loss, theft or injury sustained by owners, riders, competitors, members or the public or any other person or their property whatsoever.

- 14. Changes to Classes: The organising committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, limit, or divide classes or change arenas. Lower grade/provincial entries may be restricted, or classes cancelled, depending on number of entries. Open grade may be restricted to 210 horses. Recommended rounds per day will be in consultation with the President of the Ground Jury and SASJ Rep. WE AIM TO HAVE A LIMIT OF 210 ENTRIES PER DAY PER ARENA. Any classes that are combined will be on a handicap basis. Changes made at/during the show will be at the SHB's discretion in consultation with the Ground Jury. This also applies to adverse weather conditions. Entry Fees will not be refunded to any competitor in the event of any competition being changed to a different time, day or different arena.
- 15. The onus is on the competitor to check the programme when it is published on the website, and to ensure that their email address is updated with the SASJ office and to check the SASJ website/newsflashes for any changes to the schedule/programme. Any changes made to the programme once the final programme is published will be published on the SASJ website www.sashowjumping.co.za or sent out via newsflash.
- 16. SAEF (Previously SAEA) General Regulations apply FEI General Regulations are applicable at FEI Events. FEI Veterinary Regulations will apply for all SASJ and FEI Events for Show Jumping in South Africa.
- 17. All stallions should have a yellow disc on both sides of the bridle or have a yellow ribbon in the tail.
- 18. No person OR company may conduct, promote, hand out, receive items OR payment that may constitute doing any form of business during the show.

- 19. Should you decided to bring your Dogs Please keep Dogs on a hand held leash at all times Failure to comply will incure a R1000 Spot fine.
- 20. Right of admission for any retailers/stall is reserved. Bookings must be made before the show.
- 21. Deduction from prize money: a DEDUCTION OF 15% will be made from all Open/CSN prize money awarded at this event. This amount will be paid to SASJ to be credited to the Show jumping Fund.
- 22. The starting order will be drawn according to FEI General Regulations.
- 23. Riders are requested to provide sleeping accommodation for their grooms as there are no facilities for this purpose. Please note that the lighting of fires or smoking in the stable areas is strictly forbidden. Kindly inform your grooms. Ablutions are available in the stable area for grooms. There are electricity outlets at the stable area.
- 24. Water is precious please be aware of water wastage and help us to conserve water where possible.
- 25. Temporary electronic paddocks may be erected in demarcated areas on condition that horse/pony are not left unattended. Lunge arenas or arenas other than those demarcated for the use of the show is strictly prohibited and will be under penalty of disqualification. The use of any area sign-posted as not demarcated for this show is also strictly prohibited. No Temporary stables are allowed to be erected on the show grounds. FAILURE TO COMPLY WILL INCUR A R1000 FINE.
- 26. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONIES: Only the top 10 prize winners will enter the arena for the prize giving.
- 27. All competitors entered are obliged to compete in all competitions for which they have qualified unless they have special dispensation from the show director. Such dispensation will normally only be given where a Veterinary or medical certificate is submitted.

Relevant Special Event Rules:

SECTION 4 SASJ

THE PRESIDENTS CUP

1. ORGANISATION

The President's Cup (Cup) may be organised, outdoors, under the authority of SASJ according to the following rules.

2 DECLARATION OF STARTERS

The declaration of starters will take place after the optional competition, which must be provided on the day preceding the first competition of the Cup. At a time, fixed by the OC, the names of the Athletes and the names of the horses, who will start the first competition of the Presidents Cup, must be submitted to the OC.

3 SUBSTITUTION

No Substitution of Horse will be permitted after the commencement of the first class.

4. CUP COMPETITIONS

The Cup comprises three classes, each taking place on a different day. The total penalties incurred in the first competition, the first round of the second competition and the two rounds from the 3rd competition count towards the final placing.

ONLY The first and second competitions will be run as individual classes with their own placings.

4.1 First Competition

4.1.1 This first Competition is a competition where Athletes with equality of Penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of Penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread

4.1.2 Participation

The horse and rider combinations declared starters for the Cup.

4.1.3 Starting Order

The starting order for the first competition is drawn, in the presence of the Technical Delegate, the President of the Ground Jury, by the OC, at a time to be fixed by the OC. The draw for the starting order will be conducted in accordance with the procedure laid down in FEI Art. 252.

4.1.4 The penalties obtained by each Athlete will be the converted into points. 4 penalties will be converted into 4 points.

4.2 Second Competition

4.2.1 The second competition is a Competition against the clock, but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties and time in the first round.

4.2.2 Participation

Only Horse and Athlete combinations that have taken part in the first competition may start in this second competition.

4.2.3 Starting Order

The starting order in the second competition will be determined by a new draw in accordance with the procedure as provided for the first competition.

4.3 Third Competition

4.3.1 The third Competition is conducted under Table A against the clock over two different successive rounds at a speed of 375 m per minute, without a jump-off; in the event of equality of Penalties for first place in the overall classification for the Championship, there will be one jump-off against the clock

HEIGHT: 150 SPEED: 375mpm

4.3.2 Participation

Round A of the third Competition is compulsory for the 24 best placed Athletes and Horses (including those placed equal for 24th place) according to the cumulative Penalties over the first and second Competitions. Should there be a equality of penalties from the first and second competition then the time from the first competition will decide the final 24. Athletes must have taken part in the first Competition (completed or not) and have completed the first round of the second Competition (without having been eliminated or having retired). If, for any reason, one or more of these 24 best placed Athletes are unable to start, they may be replaced by the next best placed Athlete(s).

- 4.3.3 Athletes must note this is a SASJ Championship and sponsored event they may only withdraw from the third and Final Competition with the express permission of the OC, SASJ Rep and President of the Ground Jury or on submission of a vet's certificate or a medical certificate. Any athlete withdrawing from the final competition must notify the OC an hour after the qualification list have been published.
- 4.3.4 Round B of the third Competition is open to all Athletes and Horses (excluding eliminations and retirements) according to the cumulative Penalties over the first and second Competitions and Round A of the third Competition.
- 4.3.4 Inspecting the Course Round B Athletes will be invited to inspect the course for Round B at the conclusion of Round A.

Starting order

- The starting order for Round A will follow the reverse order of Penalties incurred in the first and second Competitions. The Athlete with the most Penalties will start first, the Athlete with the least Penalties will start last. In case of Athletes with equality of Penalties, the Score (time) in the first Competition will decide the starting order, the Athlete with the slower time starting before the Athlete with the faster time. Where possible a gap of ten horses shall be allowed between horses ridden by the same rider. This shall be achieved by the President of the Ground Jury moving that rider's first horse upwards in the order of riding.
- The starting order for Round B will follow the reverse order of total Penalties incurred in the first and second Competitions and in Round A of the third Competition. The Athlete with the most Penalties will start first, the Athlete with the least Penalties will start last. In case of Athletes with equality of Penalties, the Score (time) of the first Competition will decide the starting order, the Athlete with the slower time starting before the Athlete with the faster time. Where possible a gap of ten horses shall be allowed between horses ridden by the same rider. This shall be achieved by the President of the Ground Jury moving that rider's first horse upwards in the order of riding.
- 6. Classification and Prizes for the Third Competition

There will be no prize giving ceremony for the classification of the third Competition.

7. REST DAY

A rest day should, if possible, be scheduled between the second and third competitions.

8. PLACINGS

- 8.1. Athletes receive their overall placing by adding the Penalties incurred in the first, first round of the second and third Competitions. The Athlete who has the lowest total Penalties will be declared Winner of the Presidents Cup.
- 8.2. In the event of equality of Penalties for first place in the overall classification there will be a jump-off against the clock over at least six obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread. Athletes with equality of Penalties for any other placing will be placed according to their combined times in Rounds A and B of the third Competition, the Athlete with the faster time being placed ahead of the Athlete with the slower time.
- 8.3. If after the jump-off there are Athletes with equality of Penalties and time, the Athletes concerned will be placed equal.

10. REFUND

Should a athlete in the PR or Children's Presidents Cup not qualify or have more than 2 horse in the final class, will be refunded their entry fee.

SUBSTITUTIONS:

A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider.

For provincial classes with <u>Composite entry fee</u>, should a horse need to be substituted it may be substituted ONCE per entry only (if a composite entry of 4 classes, only ONE change may be done). Should a rider need to be substituted and the entry consists of a composite entry of 4 classes, the rider may be changed more than once. All substitutions must be given to the show holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties, a minimum of 30 minutes before the start of the relevant class.

For National classes a substitution may only take place ONCE, before the horse inspection. Should there be NO horse inspection, a substitution may only take place ONCE, by midday on the day before the National classes start, thereafter, <u>NO</u> substitutions will be permitted. All substitutions must be given to the Show Holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties.
