Show Jumping Specific Rules :

Bought entries close at noon the day before the show starts. No bought entries will be accepted after this.

Any horse / rider substituting must be completely registered in SASJ, if not a fine of R100 will be imposed for every day the horse / rider remains unregistered. This includes the height certificates for ponies which must be approved and all vaccination details up to date. Juniors and adults may be combined in any jumping classes. A minimum of 40 % prize money will be paid after levies have been deducted. All SASJ rules shall apply. **RIDERS MAY NOT HAVE MORE THAN 3 HORSES PER CLASS.**

PERC GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL DISCIPLINES

1. Payments are due on the closing date. Proof of payment must be emailed to percoffice@gmail.com by entry closing date, failing which the entry will not be processed.
2. No horse may enter the show without a horse flu vaccination and AHS, please complete details (date & batch number) on entry form.
3. No refunds/credits will be made in respect of scratchings after closing date of entries.
4. Times will be up on the notice board 24 hours prior to the commencement of a show, and the final programme will be e mailed to all members of the PERC. Non-Members may send the club secretary an e-mail requesting the programme. No times will be given over the phone.
5. Please note that the only time that is exact is the starting time for the day, all other events will run on.
6. Insofar as possible, the program and conditions relating thereto will be adhered to. However, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to make alterations in the event of unfavourable weather conditions or any other unforeseen circumstances. The Organizing Committee further reserves the right to combine, vary, divide or cancel classes if insufficient entries are received. Depending on entries classes may be combined and/or handicapped and separate prizes will not be awarded. The show holding body of the PERC reserves the right to limit entries, depending on the total number of entries received per class.
7. Should the show be cancelled for any reason only 50% of entry fees will be refunded. No entries will be refunded if the show is postponed. PE Riding Club reserves the right to limit the number of entries.
8. The SAEF, DSA, SASA, SAEQA, SASJ, ESA and the Port Elizabeth Riding Club, including their staff , organizers , committee members and all officials appointed by them , shall in no way be held responsible for any damage, loss or injury sustained to or by owners, competitors, grooms, horses , members of the public or any other person or persons or their property at the PE Riding Club for the duration of show. 9. Please note that all PERC arenas of are out of bounds at all times except during shows.
10. All horses / ponies that are prone to kicking must wear a red ribbon on their tails
11. No fires are allowed anywhere on the premises at any time except in the designated braai area
12. By entering a stallion at the PERC, the competitor & owner agree to the following:
 1. Competition stallions remain the responsibility of the owner and rider at all times and are expected to have public liability against any loss, injury or damage that might be caused by the stallion
 2. It is the responsibility of the owner & rider to ensure that the stallion cannot exit the stable allocated to it on its own/or with the help of another horse or uninformed person.
 3. The stallion may only be removed from the stable during the show for exercise, preparation or competition & only by a responsible handler or rider.
 4. Under NO circumstances shall the covering of mares be allowed to take place at the PERC premises.
 5. All stallions must wear a yellow tag on their bridles at all times.
13. All dogs must be on leads
14. PERC ground staff will close all perimeter gates as well as the gates of the stable block at the end of each show day. PERC will not accept responsibility nor liability for any gates that are thereafter left open by riders, owners or grooms. **NO TEMPORARY PADDOCKS IN THE HORSE BOX PARKING AREA**
15. It is the responsibility of all competitors to ensure they and their horses are correctly registered with all National and Provincial bodies. All FEI and SAEF rules shall apply.

SECTION 9 SASJ RISING STAR SERIES

1. THE SERIES

The SA Show Jumping Rising Star Series is a series in South Africa for our top and upcoming Young Riders, Junior, and Pony Riders.

The series class Legs and Final Series class will carry CSN1* Status.

2. QUALIFICATION OF RIDERS

2.1 U25

The Series is a special class restricted to riders from the beginning of year they turn sixteen years of age to the end of the year they turn twenty-five.

2.2 JUNIOR

The Series is a special class restricted to riders from the beginning of year they turn twelve years of age to the end of the year they turn eighteen.

2.3 PONY RIDER

The Series is a special class restricted to riders competing on ponies up to the end of the year the rider turns sixteen as per SASJ Annexure A and B

3. QUALIFICATION OF HORSES

Open to all horses/Ponies from the age of seven.

4. PRELIMINARY COMPETITIONS PRIOR TO EACH SERIES COMPETITION

At each event, the Organising Committee shall include in the schedule at least one preliminary competition for Open horses/Ponies.

5. ORDER OF STARTING

5.1 The order of starting in all the legs of the competitions shall be drawn.

5.2 Where possible, a gap of at least ten horses shall be allowed between horses ridden by the same rider. This shall be achieved by moving that rider's first horse drawn upwards in the order of riding.

5.3 Should a rider have more than one horse entered in any of the series competitions, then that rider shall declare, prior to the commencement of the class, which horse will be going for the series points and that horse must be ridden first in all the competitions.

6. RULES

6.1 U25

All series competitions will be run over Championship courses of National Standard (1,35m with some fences at 1.40m) run at a speed of 375 mpm.

Preliminary classes at each event will be run at a speed of 375mpm, or the speed of the relevant competitions at the show.

The qualifying rounds will be run under **FEI Art 238.2.2**.

6.2 JUNIOR

All series competitions will be run over Championship courses of National Standard (1,30m with some fences at 1.35m) run at a speed of 375 mpm.

Preliminary classes at each event will be run at a speed of 375mpm, or the speed of the relevant competitions at the show.

The qualifying rounds will be run under **FEI Art 238.2.2.**

6.3 PONY RIDER

All series competitions will be run over Championship courses of National Standard (1,10m with some fences at 1.15m) run at a speed of 350 mpm.

Preliminary classes at each event will be run at a speed of 350mpm, or the speed of the relevant competitions at the show.

The qualifying rounds will be run under **FEI Art 238.2.2.**

7 ELIGIBILITY

All competitions are open to all riders and Horses/Ponies as per Annexure A and B Riders qualified to compete in Open Classes provided, they have the necessary QR's and Age Category.

Horse/Pony and Rider combinations need to be entered into the whole Event where the Series classes are taking place.

8 POINTS

Points will be awarded to riders in accordance with the Qualification points system as set out in 10 below.

Points for the series will be calculated from the best of 3 Qualifiers to obtain the Series final overall results.

9 CLASSIFICATION

Should there be a tie for first place overall after completion of the series, the highest placed competitor Combination in the last competition will be declared the Series winner.

VACCINATIONS:

SOUTH AFRICAN EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS, EQUINE INFLUENZA & AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS.

HORSES' ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE – SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS Article 1001 – Equine Identification

Horses or Ponies that do not have FEI Passports must have a SAEF Group IX Passport to compete in South Africa.

1. Person Responsible (PRs) must comply with the requirements for national and SAEF Passports, Recognition Cards and registration for Events as described in the General Regulations.

Summary of SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS - AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS

EQUINE INFLUENZA

All horses & Ponies competing at SAEF Events must have an Equine Influenza Vaccine within 6 months and 21 days of competition.

All horses must have had a PRIMARY Course of Equine Influenza (Only Exception are horses that have been vaccinated every year without a primary course since 2005)

VACCINE 1 (V1) First Vaccine of the Primary Course. Horse is Not eligible to compete.

VACCINE 2 (V2) First Booster. Administered between 21 – 92 days after V1.

(From 2023 it will be 21 days – 60 days)

Horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days.

VACCINE 3 (V3) Second Booster of the PRIMARY Course administered 6 months after V2.

Thereafter, if the horse is not competing booster vaccines may be given every 12 months, BUT if the year is exceeded, a Primary course must be repeated.

For competition purposes the horse must have an Equine Influenza vaccine with 6 months and 21 days of competition. EG your horse has had V1 – V3. You do not compete, but 10 months later you decide to enter a competition. Ensure that an Equine Influenza vaccine is administered, and your horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days. It is not necessary to repeat the Primary Course if you have not exceeded a year.

NB: NO HORSE MAY COMPETE FOR 7 DAYS FOLLOWING ANY VACCINATION

AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS (AHS)

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa, and as such the State Veterinary Department must be notified of any positive cases. According to the Government "Animal Diseases Act 35 of 1984" all Equidae must be vaccinated against AHS annually, (except in the controlled AHS Zones of the Western Cape)

The only vaccine currently registered in terms of Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act no 36 of 47) for AHS and therefore the only efficient/effective remedy "as described above is the live virus vaccine produced by Onderstepoort Biological Products (OBP).

For Competition purposes the following apply:

- i) Horses Must be vaccinated against AHS 1 & AHS2 once in a calendar year. (Exception is the Free & Surveillance zones of the AHS controlled area, who require written permission for vaccination from State Vet Boland
- ii) The only accepted registered vaccine for competition purposes is the OBP vaccine, in terms of the "Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies & Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act 36 of 47).
- iii) AHS vaccines must be administered by a veterinarian, who is required to sign and stamp the passport.
- iv) Vaccines must be administered with a minimum of 3 weeks (21 days) apart. Vaccines given less than 3 weeks will invalidate both vaccines. (It has come to the notice of SAEF the growing number of horses that are receiving the second AHS vaccine within 15 to 20 days of the first. Not only is the horse ineligible to compete, but the welfare of the horse becomes compromised.)
- v) For competition purposes horses residing in the Free & Surveillance Zones of the Western Cape do not require AHS vaccine. However, should they leave the Free U Surveillance zones they will be required to have AHS vaccine, both for competition purposes and for movement back into the controlled area.
- vi) Vaccination is only allowed in the Controlled Zones, between 1st June and 31st October each year. Whilst it is strongly recommended that horses are not vaccinated during high midge prevalence, vaccination times are not legislated in the Infected zone.
- vii) Due to the shortage of AHS vaccine during 2022, the SAEF issued a dispensation for all competition horses.
"For competition purposes horses must receive one AHS1 and one AHS 2 vaccine between 1st June 2021 and 31st December 2023. Check SAEF for any updates as they are closely monitoring the situation.

FEI REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS (FEI GENERAL REGULATIONS ART. 137)

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI for the current year.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

FEI REGULATIONS ON EQUINE INFLUENZA (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ART. 1003)

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza

in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

HORSE VACCINATIONS	<i>It is the Athlete/Owners responsibility to ensure that they comply with the control measures of AHS and EQUINE FLU as per SAEF Regulations and are in the horses' passports which must always accompany the horse/pony</i>
MICROCHIP NO's	<i>Microchip numbers must be in the horses passport and SASJ Online System</i>
LIABILITY	<i>The FEI, SASJ, SAEF, The OC/SHB, Venue, Officials and sponsors shall in no way be held responsible for any damage, loss, theft, or injury sustained by owners, riders, competitors, horses, members or the public or any other person or their property whatsoever. E&OE</i>
CHANGES TO CLASSES	<p><i>The organising committee in consultation with the SASJ Representative reserve the right to combine, handicap, divide or cancel classes should this be necessary, always provided such amendments are not in conflict with the rules. Where necessary, classes may be restricted to qualifications. 80% of entry fees will be refunded should the class/s be cancelled due to inclement weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.</i></p> <p><i>The organising committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, limit, or divide classes or change arenas. Lower grade/provincial entries may be restricted, or classes cancelled, depending on number of entries. Recommended rounds per day will be in consultation with the President of the Ground Jury and SASJ Rep.</i></p> <p><i>Any classes that are combined will be on a handicap basis. Changes made at/during the show will be at the SHB's discretion in consultation with the Ground Jury. This also applies to adverse weather conditions.
