### **CODE OF CONDUCT**

#### **FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to always acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia, and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

**CLOSING DATE: Friday 24<sup>th</sup> May 2024**

*Entries need to be done directly on the SASJ Online System and payment done via Payfast.*

**NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

*Entries accepted on the online system – should the show be oversubscribed the SASJ Online ranking system will be implemented with Rankings per province.*

*Bought and Sold Entries will be allowed as long as the correct documentation is submitted within the correct time frames and the original rider has signed the form.*

*There will be no buying and selling of entries after 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2024. Forms received thereafter will not be accepted.*

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- REFUNDS:** No Refunds will be given after closing date of entries. Entries withdrawn before close of date will be refunded. However due to inclement weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances, should it necessitate cancelling a class or the show, 80% of the entry fee will be refunded.
- Bank Details:** **All entries to be paid for online via EFT. Unpaid entries will be deleted on closing date and will not be restored should arenas be full.**
- ENTRY FEE:** **Open classes R550 per class** which includes R75 per class SASJ Levy, R50 Ground Levy, R5.13 EDS Levy per class. R25 medical & security levy per class. R50 officials levy per class, excl. VAT.  
**All Other Classes: R550 per class** which includes R55 per class SASJ Levy, R50 Ground levy per class, R5.13 EDS Levy, R25 medical & security levy per class & 15% VAT). R50 officials levy per class excl. VAT.
- RESTRICTIONS:** **Grand Prix class, a competitor may only ride 3 – three horses.**  
 A horse may only compete in One class per day (National) and 2 classes per day (Provincial) with a maximum of 3 classes at the event and only 1 championship class.  
***Should your entry be deleted for non-payment, the entry will not be restored based on when it was initially done but will be based on when it was paid for thus if the arenas are full, it will be added to the waiting list.***
- Riders with Dual Licence:** Riders with a dual licence may only enter one category Junior OR Adult at each event.  
*When competing in an adult class/s at an Event, a rider with dual Licence may not ride in any other age categories at that event*
- NOMINATIONS:** Declarations for classes (1.30m - 1.50m) taking place on the first day must be done via e-mail or What's App to Retha or Betsie no later than 12h00 on Wednesday 5 June 2024  
**Riders who fail to make this declaration in time will automatically be entered in the same class as entered on the SASJ Entry system.**  
 Declarations will close 30 min after the end of the last open class on each day.  
**Riders who fail to make this declaration in time will automatically be entered in the same class as indicated entered on the SASJ entry system.**
- STARTING FEES:** **Inc in Entry Fee:** If not qualified for the SA Indoor Grand Prix – combinations can compete in the lower National class that day.
- QUALIFICATIONS:** N/A
- PRIZE MONEY:** A minimum of 60% net of entry fees less levies and VAT for CSN classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies and VAT Provincial classes plus sponsorship per class. This excludes sponsorship money that will be independently allocated by the OC. **All CSN Jumping classes will be subject to a 15% deduction from prize money to be paid into the SASJ Riders Fund.**

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**SUBSTITUTIONS:** A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider.  
For provincial classes with, should a horse need to be substituted it may be substituted ONCE per entry only (if a composite entry of 4 classes, only ONE change may be done). Should a rider need to be substituted and the entry consists of a composite entry of 4 classes, the rider may be changed more than once. All substitutions must be given to the show holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties, a minimum of 30 minutes before the start of the relevant class. For National classes, a substitution may only take place ONCE, before the horse inspection. Should there be NO horse inspection, a substitution may only take place ONCE, by midday on the day before the National classes start, thereafter, and NO substitutions will be permitted. All substitutions must be given to the Show Holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties.

**DRESS:** Jackets Only

**STABLING:** Stabling will be available at **R1200 for duration of show**. Stabling is limited and will be booked on a first come first serve basis, should you require to be stabled together with another rider please send Retha an e-mail retha@tbgequine.co.za. Initial bedding will be provided.

**STABLING AFTER SHOW** R750 for 3 extra nights this will include 10 extra bags of shavings

## **NO PADDOCKS WILL BE ALLOWED TO BE ERECTED ON THE VENUE**

Initial Bedding will be provided, additional bedding will be available to purchase at R30 per bag. The allocation of stabling accommodation is carried out by the Show Director and under no circumstances may any competitor change his/her stabling accommodation or alter the stabling list without prior consultation with, and approval of, the Show director. Failure to comply could involve disqualification of the horse concerned. Stables will be allocated to out of Province rider first, on a first come first paid basis. Competitors wishing to be stabled with others should indicate this by e-mailing Retha, however, please bear in mind that if the person you are wanting to be stabled with has booked early and you have booked late or vice versa this allocation may not be possible as stables are allocated strictly on a first booked and paid for basis. The grooms are encouraged to hand walk horses.

**ACCESS:** All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

**ACCREDITATION:** N/A

**PASSPORTS:** All horses must be in possession of their FEI Passports or Group IX Passports at all shows. Inspections, sampling, and random passport checks may take place at any event. All

horses competing in FEI Classes must have FEI passports or FEI Recognition cards and must be registered with the FEI for 2022 Horse Registrations.

#### **'EQUINE TESTING**

All horses or ponies competing at SASJ and/or FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses or ponies may be selected for sampling in accordance with the obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures.

MCP testing as per SAEF Regulations will be done by the appointed Testing Vet.

Laboratory: National Horse Racing Authority, Turffontein Racecourse, Turf Club Street.

FEI testing will be as per FEI regulations by an appointed FEI Testing vet and sent to the FEI Appointed Laboratory.

#### **HUMAN ANTI DOPING**

All Athletes can be tested at any FEI/and or SASJ event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organizations with Testing Jurisdiction.

#### **VACCINATIONS:**

##### **SOUTH AFRICAN EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS, EQUINE INFLUENZA & AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS.**

##### **HORSES' ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE – SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS Article 1001 – Equine Identification**

Horses or Ponies that do not have FEI Passports must have a SAEF Group IX Passport to compete in South Africa.

1. Person Responsible (PRs) must comply with the requirements for national and SAEF Passports, Recognition Cards and registration for Events as described in the General Regulations.

##### **Summary of SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS - AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS**

##### **EQUINE INFLUENZA**

All horses & Ponies competing at SAEF Events must have an Equine Influenza Vaccine within 6 months and 21 days of competition.

All horses must have had a PRIMARY Course of Equine Influenza (Only Exception are horses that have been vaccinated every year without a primary course since 2005)

VACCINE 1 (V1) First Vaccine of the Primary Course. Horse is Not eligible to compete.

VACCINE 2 (V2) First Booster. Administered between 21 – 92 days after V1.

(From 2023 it will be 21 days – 60 days)

Horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days.

VACCINE 3 (V3) Second Booster of the PRIMARY Course administered 6 months after V2.

Thereafter, if the horse is not competing booster vaccines may be given every 12 months, BUT if the year is exceeded, a Primary course must be repeated.

For competition purposes the horse must have an Equine Influenza vaccine with 6 months and 21 days of competition. EG your horse has had V1 – V3. You do not compete, but 10 months later you decide to enter a competition. Ensure that an Equine Influenza vaccine is administered, and your horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days. It is not necessary to repeat the

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Primary Course if you have not exceeded a year.

**NB: NO HORSE MAY COMPETE FOR 7 DAYS FOLLOWING ANY VACCINATION**

### **AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS (AHS)**

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa, and as such the State Veterinary Department must be notified of any positive cases. According to the Government "Animal Diseases Act 35 of 1984" all Equidae must be vaccinated against AHS annually, (except in the controlled AHS Zones of the Western Cape)

The only vaccine currently registered in terms of Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act no 36 of 47) for AHS and therefore the only efficient/effective remedy "as described above is the live virus vaccine produced by Onderstepoort Biological Products (OBP).

For Competition purposes the following apply:

- i) Horses Must be vaccinated against AHS 1 & AHS2 once in a calendar year. (Exception is the Free & Surveillance zones of the AHS controlled area, who require written permission for vaccination from State Vet Boland
- ii) The only accepted registered vaccine for competition purposes is the OBP vaccine, in terms of the "Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies & Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act 36 of 47).
- iii) AHS vaccines must be administered by a veterinarian, who is required to sign and stamp the passport.
- iv) Vaccines must be administered with a minimum of 3 weeks (21 days) apart. Vaccines given less than 3 weeks will invalidate both vaccines. (It has come to the notice of SAEF the growing number of horses that are receiving the second AHS vaccine within 15 to 20 days of the first. Not only is the horse ineligible to compete, but the welfare of the horse becomes compromised.)
- v) For competition purposes horses residing in the Free & Surveillance Zones of the Western Cape do not require AHS vaccine. However, should they leave the Free U Surveillance zones they will be required to have AHS vaccine, both for competition purposes and for movement back into the controlled area.
- vi) Vaccination is only allowed in the Controlled Zones, between 1<sup>st</sup> June and 31<sup>st</sup> October each year. Whilst it is strongly recommended that horses are not vaccinated during high midge prevalence, vaccination times are not legislated in the Infected zone.
- vii) Due to the shortage of AHS vaccine during 2022, the SAEF issued a dispensation for all competition horses.  
"For competition purposes horses must receive one AHS1 and one AHS 2 vaccine between 1<sup>st</sup> June 2021 and 31<sup>st</sup> December 2023. **Check SAEF for any updates as they are closely monitoring the situation.**

### **FEI REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS (FEI GENERAL REGULATIONS ART. 137)**

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI for the current year.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

### **FEI REGULATIONS ON EQUINE INFLUENZA (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ART. 1003)**

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

# SECTION 8 SOUTH AFRICAN INDOOR GRAND PRIX

## THE ADULT, YOUNG RIDER, JUNIOR, PONY RIDER INDOOR GRAND PRIX OF SOUTH AFRICA

### 1. CLASSIFICATION

Only the 3 (Three) competitions approved and authorised by SASJ as such shall be the official National Grand Prix Titles for SA Show Jumping, all hereinafter referred to as to the Grand Prix unless referred to by the below names:

- \* SASJ Senior National Indoor Grand Prix
- \* SASJ Junior National Indoor Grand Prix
- \* SASJ Pony Rider National Indoor Grand Prix

and no other competition held in the area of jurisdiction of SASJ and called a "Grand Prix" may use the additional words "of South Africa" or any similar wording. These competitions must be staged indoors.

### 2 ALLOCATION

Provinces and SHB should timeously send completed National EOI's and SLA's to be received by the 1<sup>st</sup> of September each year. SASJ Exco will allocated the necessary events depending on Allocation and EOI's and allocate as soon as possible to the National Calendar.

### 3. THE QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS

**3.1** There shall be two qualifying competitions preceding the Grand Prix.

- a. FEI Article 238.2.1 - A 2 Competition – qualifying class
- b. FEI Article 274.2 - Competition in 2 Phases – qualifying class

**3.2** To compete in the championship horse and athlete combinations must complete at least one of the qualifying classes.

**3.3** The Qualification for the top Horse and Rider ranked combinations.

- a. Adult & U25 top **30 (thirty)** ranked combinations per class.
- b. Junior top **24 (twenty-four)** ranked combination per class.
- c. Pony Rider top **20 (twenty)** ranked combinations per class.

**3.4** In all qualifying competitions irrespective of the number of starters, the competitor placed first receives 50 points, the second receives 47 points, the third receives 45 points, and the fourth receives 44 points and so on reducing by one point per place.

- 3.5 In the case of ties for any place in any of the qualifying competitions, the competitors that tie shall each receive the full points entitlement of that place that they would have received had there been no tie.
- 3.6 No Athlete is permitted to ride more than two horses in the S A Indoor Grand Prix class. In the event of an Athlete qualifying more than two horses, the organising committee shall immediately notify the Athlete of the final list of qualifiers, and then obtain the Athletes' decision as to which two horses that Athlete intends to ride in the SA Indoor Grand Prix class.
- 3.7 In the Grand Prix the order of starting shall be in ascending order of points gained in the qualifying competitions in reverse order of merit.

#### **4 THE GRAND PRIX CLASS**

4.1 This competition is conducted over an Indoor Grand Prix type course conducted over two rounds. The number of efforts in the first round must be limited to 15 and 9 in the second round.

The order of starting in the second round shall be in reverse order of penalties in the first round: Athletes retain their draw order in case of equality of penalties.

The competition shall be judged in accordance with:

FEI Art 273.1

FEI Art 273.3.3.2

FEI Art 273.4.3

4.2 All horses except those who were eliminated or retired in the first round, will take part in the second round.

4.3 The second round shall be over a shortened course, the obstacles for which may be altered in height and/or spread at the sole discretion of the course designer.

4.4 Athletes will be placed according to the penalties over both rounds and time in the second round.

#### **5 SPEED**

The minimum speed for the S A Indoor Grand Prix is 350mpm.

#### **6 Eligibility of Athletes, Owners, and Horses**

##### **6.1 Athletes and Owners and Horses**

6.1.1 Eligibility of Athletes, Owners, and horses/ponies as per Appendix A, B & C

6.1.2 An Athlete and Horse/Pony combination are only eligible to compete in one

Indoor Grand Prix title in a calendar year. This does not include special competitions.

## **6.2 Horses**

### **6.2.1 Senior S A Indoor Grand Prix**

Horses must be registered with SASJ at the closing date of Entries.

Horses must be 7 years and older.

Height: 1.50m

### **6.2.2 Junior SA Indoor Grand Prix**

Horses must be registered with SASJ at the closing date of Entries.

Horses must be 7 years and older.

Height: 1.30/1.35m

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### **6.2.3 Pony SA Indoor Grand Prix is restricted to Ponies as per Annexure A & C**

Horses must be registered with SASJ at the closing date of Entries.

SASJ Ponies heights apply and must be 6 years or older.

Height: 1.10./1.15mm

## **7 Entries**

7.1 The SA Adult Indoor Grand Prix shall not be classified as official, nor the trophies and medals awarded, unless there are-10 starters in the S A Indoor Grand Prix Application may be made to SASJ Executive to waiver this rule.

7.2 The SA Junior and Pony Rider Indoor Grand Prix shall not be classified as official, nor the trophies and medals awarded, unless there are at least 8 starters in the SA Indoor Grand Prix.- Application may be made to SASJ Executive to waiver this rule.

## **8 REQUIREMENTS**

8.1 Substitutions of horses will not be allowed after the Veterinary Inspection has taken place.

8.2 An entry shall be one horse and rider combination.

8.3 Each Indoor Grand Prix shall be staged only once in any one calendar year and shall only be staged at CSN Events

8.4 All Indoor Grand Prix's shall be allocated to Provinces by SASJ, and no Outdoor Grand Prix shall be allocated unless SASJ is satisfied that the required standards will be upheld at the event.

## **SOUTH AFRICA SHOW JUMPING SCHEDULE – 2024**

- 8.5 The Organising Committee is required to ensure that the following words appear in the schedule and in the programme for the Events beneath the description of all qualifying competitions.

*"Recognised as a qualifying competition."*

- 8.6 SASJ Electronic Timing, approved by SASJ Exco incorporating a displayed countdown facility, is obligatory for all qualifying classes as well as the South African Championship class.
- 8.7 No entry fee may be charged for the S A Championship class itself. The Organising committee may however charge a starting fee. For purposes of determining of entry fee levies, such starting fee shall be deemed an entry fee.
