CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farrier and tack and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

<p><u>CLOSING DATE:</u></p>	<p>15th November 2024</p> <p>Entries need to be done directly on the SASJ Online System NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.</p> <p>Entries accepted on the online system – should the show be oversubscribed the SASJ Online ranking system will be implemented with Rankings per province.</p> <p>Bought and Sold Entries will be allowed if the correct documentation is submitted within the correct time frames and the original rider has signed the form.</p> <p>There will be no buying and selling of entries after closing date of entries. Forms received thereafter will not be accepted!!</p>
<p><u>REFUNDS:</u></p>	<p>No Refunds will be given after closing date of entries. Entries withdrawn before closing date will be refunded. However due to inclement weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances, should it necessitate cancelling a class or classes, 80% of the entry fee will be refunded.</p>

<p><u>RESTRICTIONS:</u></p>	<p>A horse may only compete in One class per day (National) and 2 classes per day (Provincial) with a maximum of 3 classes at the event for CSN classes.</p> <p>Should your entry be deleted for non-payment, the entry will not be restored based on when it was initially done but will be based on when it was paid for thus if the show is full, it will be added to the waiting list.</p>
<p><u>SUBSTITUTIONS:</u></p>	<p>A Substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider.</p> <p>For National classes a substitution of a horse may only take place ONCE, before the horse inspection. Should there be NO horse inspection, a substitution of a horse may only take place ONCE, by midday on the day before the National classes start, therefore NO substitutions of horses will be permitted. Substitution of rider is permitted.</p> <p>Provincial classes: All substitutions must be given to the show holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties, a minimum of 30 minutes before the start of the relevant class.</p>
<p><u>PRIZE MONEY:</u></p>	<p>A minimum of 60% net entry fee less levies for CSN classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies Provincial classes plus sponsorship per class if available. This excludes sponsorship money that will be independently allocated by the OC. All CSN Jumping classes will be subject to a 15% deduction from prize money to be paid into the SASJ Riders Fund.</p>

SECTION 5 SASJ RIDERS GRAND PRIX EVENTS

1. EVENT

The Riders Tour Competition Series consists of Competitions held at National Events or National Events including FEI World Cup Qualifiers which have been approved by SASJ to be part of the series.

SHB Need to apply to SA Showjumping to be included in the series. The series is open to riders registered as Adult Cat 1 Riders for the current year.

2. REGULATIONS

The Series will be run under the following regulations:

The Riders Tour Series shall consist of 3 Series.

2.1 Riders Gold Grand Prix Tour

- 2.1.1 Height – First Round Grand Prix Type course at 1.40m with 4 fences at 1.45m
- 2.1.2 Second Round over shortened course consisting of at least 8 fences including one combination.
- 2.1.3 Course Walk for second round at discretion of Ground Jury and Course Designer
- 2.1.4 Speed – 375mpm
- 2.1.5 Rules - FEI Article 273.3.3.1, 273.4.3, 273.2.2.2.ii (at least 25%)
- 2.1.6 3 Horses per Athlete
- 2.1.7 Water Jump may be included should one be available at the discretion of the course designer.
- 2.1.8 Competition to be held as the last class for the 1.40m level.

2.2 Riders Silver Grand Prix Tour

- 2.2.1 Height – First Round Grand Prix Type course at 1.35m with 4 fences at 1.40m
- 2.2.2 Second Round over a shortened course consisting of at least 8 fences including one combination.
- 2.2.3 Course Walk for second round at discretion of Ground Jury and Course Designer
- 2.2.4 Speed – 375mpm
- 2.2.5 Rules - FEI Article 273.3.3.1, 273.4.3, 273.2.2.2.ii (at least 25%)
- 2.2.6 3 Horses per Athlete
- 2.2.7 Water Jump may be included should one be available at the discretion of the course designer.
- 2.2.8 Competition to be held as the last class for the 1.35m level.

2.3 Riders Bronze Grand Prix Tour

- 2.3.1 Height – First Round Grand Prix Type course at 1.30m with 4 fences at 1.35m
- 2.3.2 Second Round over a shortened course consisting of at least 8 fences including one combination.
- 2.3.3 Course Walk for second round at discretion of Ground Jury and Course Designer
- 2.3.4 Speed – 350mpm
- 2.3.5 Rules - FEI Article 273.3.3.1, 273.4.3, 273.2.2.2.ii (at least 25%)
- 2.3.6 3 Horses per Athlete
- 2.3.7 Water Jump may be included should one be available at the discretion of the course

designer.

2.3.8 Competition to be held as the last class for the 1.30m level.

3. DESCRIPTION OF THE RULES

The competition will be run over 2 rounds. Both rounds against the clock.

At least 25% return for the second round, based on their penalties and time in the first round; in any case all Athletes without penalties in the first round, return for the second round.

Starting order of the second round shall be reverse order of penalties and time in the first round, and Athletes retain their draw order in case of equality of penalties and time.

Athletes will be placed according to aggregate Penalties over both rounds and the time incurred in the second round. Athletes not taking part in the second round according to their Penalties and time in the first round.

A system of points for rankings will be allocated at the end of each competition as follows:

SOUTH AFRICAN EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS, EQUINE INFLUENZA & AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS.

HORSES' ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE – SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS Article 1001 – Equine Identification

Horses or Ponies that do not have FEI Passports must have a SAEF Group IX Passport to compete in South Africa.

1. Person Responsible (PRs) must comply with the requirements for national and SAEF Passports, Recognition Cards and registration for Events as described in the General Regulations.

Summary of SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS - AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS

EQUINE INFLUENZA

All horses & Ponies competing at SAEF Events must have an Equine Influenza Vaccine within 6 months and 21 days of competition.

All horses must have had a PRIMARY Course of Equine Influenza (Only Exception are horses that have been vaccinated every year without a primary course since 2005)

VACCINE 1 (V1) First Vaccine of the Primary Course. Horse is Not eligible to compete.

VACCINE 2 (V2) First Booster. Administered between 21 – 92 days after V1.

(From 2024 it will be 21 days – 60 days)

Horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days.

VACCINE 3 (V3) Second Booster of the PRIMARY Course administered within 6 months after V2.

Thereafter, if the horse is not competing booster vaccines may be given every 12 months, BUT if the year is exceeded, a Primary course must be repeated.

For competition purposes the horse must have an Equine Influenza vaccine with 6 months and 21 days of competition. EG your horse has had V1 – V3. You do not compete, but 10 months later you decide to enter a competition. Ensure that an Equine Influenza vaccine is administered, and your horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days. It is not necessary to repeat the Primary Course if you have not exceeded a year.

NB: NO HORSE MAY COMPETE FOR 7 DAYS FOLLOWING ANY VACCINATION

AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS (AHS)

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa, and as such the State Veterinary Department must be notified of any positive cases. According to the Government "Animal Diseases Act 35 of 1984" all Equidae must be vaccinated against AHS annually, (except in the controlled AHS Zones of the Western Cape)

The only vaccine currently registered in terms of Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act no 36 of 47) for AHS and therefore the only efficient/effective remedy "as described above is the live virus vaccine produced by Onderstepoort Biological Products (OBP).

For Competition purposes the following apply:

- i) Horses Must be vaccinated against AHS 1 & AHS2 once in a calendar year. (Exception is the Free & Surveillance zones of the AHS controlled area, who require written permission for vaccination from State Vet Boland

- ii) The only accepted registered vaccine for competition purposes is the OBP vaccine, in terms of the “Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies & Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act 36 of 47).
- iii) AHS vaccines must be administered by a veterinarian, who is required to sign and stamp the passport.
- iv) Vaccines must be administered with a minimum of 3 weeks (21 days) apart. Vaccines given less than 3 weeks will invalidate both vaccines. (It has come to the notice of SAEF the growing number of horses that are receiving the second AHS vaccine within 15 to 20 days of the first. Not only is the horse ineligible to compete, but the welfare of the horse becomes compromised.)
- v) For competition purposes horses residing in the Free & Surveillance Zones of the Western Cape do not require AHS vaccine. However, should they leave the Free U Surveillance zones they will be required to have AHS vaccine, both for competition purposes and for movement back into the controlled area.
- vi) Vaccination is only allowed in the Controlled Zones, between 1st June and 31st October each year. Whilst it is strongly recommended that horses are not vaccinated during high midge prevalence, vaccination times are not legislated in the Infected zone.

URGENT UPDATE IN RED

UPDATED AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS (AHS) VACCINATIONS

i) For competition purposes in the AHS infected zone, horses must have received at least one “AHS 1” and one “ AHS 2” vaccine between **1 June 2022** and 1st December 2025.

For movement into the AHS controlled area of the Western Cape, a horse must have received its AHS Vaccines within 24 months of entry. Any change to this requirement will be communicated by DALRRD and is outside the administrative control of SAEF.

FEI REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS (FEI GENERAL REGULATIONS ART. 137)

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI for the current year.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

FEI REGULATIONS ON EQUINE INFLUENZA (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ART. 1003)

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.
