VACCINATIONS:

SOUTH AFRICAN EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS, EQUINE INFLUENZA & AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS.

HORSES' ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE – SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS Article 1001 – Equine Identification

Horses or Ponies that do not have FEI Passports must have a SAEF Group IX Passport to compete in South Africa.

1. Person Responsible (PRs) must comply with the requirements for national and SAEF Passports, Recognition Cards and registration for Events as described in the General Regulations.

Summary of SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS - AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS

Please check for any Updated SAEF Vaccination Directives

EQUINE INFLUENZA

All horses & Ponies competing at SAEF Events must have an Equine Influenza Vaccine within 6 months and 21 days of competition. All horses must have had a PRIMARY Course of Equine Influenza (Only Exception are horses that have been vaccinated every year without a primary course since 2005)

VACCINE 1 (V1) First Vaccine of the Primary Course. Horse is Not eligible to compete.

VACCINE 2 (V2) First Booster. Administered between 21 – 60 days after V1.
(prior to January 2024 = 21 – 92 days)

Horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days.

VACCINE 3 (V3) Second Booster of the PRIMARY Course administered WITHIN 6 months after V2.
(Prior to January 2024 within 7 months of V2) these horses vaccinated prior to January 1 January 2024, according to the protocol in place at the time, are no required to redo their primary Vaccinations)

Thereafter, if the horse is not competing booster vaccines may be given every 12 months, BUT if the year is exceeded, a Primary course must be repeated.

For competition purposes the horse must have an Equine Influenza vaccine with 6 months and 21 days of competition. EG your horse has had V1 – V3. You do not compete, but 10 months later you decide to enter a competition. Ensure that an Equine Influenza vaccine is administered, and your horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days. It is not necessary to repeat the Primary Course if you have not exceeded a year.

NB: NO HORSE MAY COMPETE FOR 7 DAYS FOLLOWING ANY VACCINATION

All horses must have their Equine Influenza Primary Course Vaccinations recorded in their latest FEI Group IX Passport by 30th April 2024. If a horse's passport is found upon inspection, to not have the Equine Influenza Primary Course Vaccination recorded, the horse will not be eligible to compete in a competition. Please note below the wording to be used by the veterinarian, for the vaccination history to be transferred to the latest FEI Group IX Passport:

The vaccination history and primary course of this horse is correct to date in accordance with the FEI Veterinary Regulations. Last Vaccination on 00/00/00 date > Must be signed, stamped and dated by the veterinarian.

The last vaccination in the previous passport must be transcribed into the new passport by the veterinarian.

AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS (AHS)

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa, and as such the State Veterinary Department must be notified of any positive cases. According to the Government "Animal Diseases Act 35 of 1984" all Equidae must be vaccinated against AHS annually, (except in the controlled AHS Zones of the Western Cape)

The only vaccine currently registered in terms of Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act no 36 of 47) for AHS and therefore the only efficient/effective remedy "as described above is the live virus vaccine produced by Onderstepoort Biological Products (OBP).

For Competition purposes the following apply:

- i) As per the directive issued on the 8th August 2024, for competition purposes in the AHS infected zone, horses must have received at least ONE AHS Bottle 1 and one AHS bottle 2 vaccine between 1 June 2022 and 1 December 2025
- ii) From 1 December 2025 for competition purposes in the AHS infected zone, horses must have received at least one AHS 1 and one AHS 2 vaccine in a calendar year. (i.e. between 1 January and 31st December each year)
- iii) Horses residing in the AHS Controlled area within the AHS free and surveillance zones of the Cape do not require AHS vaccination in order to compete. However, should these horses leave the AHS controlled area, they will require vaccination against AHS as described in i) and ii) above.

For movement into the AHS controlled area of the Western Cape, a horse must have received its AHS vaccinations within 24 months of entry. Any changes to this requirement will be communicated by DALRRD and is outside the administrative control of SAEF.

- iv) Horse residing within the AHS protection zone require AHS vaccination in order to compete both within the AHS controlled area and, within the AHS infected zone as described in i) and ii).
- v) The only accepted registered vaccine for competition purposes is the Onderstepoort Biological Products vaccine, as it is currently the only registered vaccine against AHS in terms of the "Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act 36 of 47)
- vi) AHS vaccines must be supplied and administered by a registered veterinarian, who is required to sign and stamp the passport as part of the vaccination certification.
- vii) The current AHS vaccine is an attenuated live vaccine supplied in 2 bottles AHS1 and AHS2.

The two vaccine bottles must be administered at least 3 (three) weeks apart. If vaccines are given less than 3 weeks apart, both vaccines are invalidated, making the horse ineligible to compete and compromising its welfare.

Research has shown that leaving a longer interval between vaccines is better for producing greater immunity.

- viii) In the AHS infected zone, it is strongly recommended that horses are not vaccinated during periods of high midge prevalence due to the risk of vaccine virus transmission by the midge vector.
- ix) **AHS vaccination is only allowed in the AHS controlled area between 1st June and 31st October each year due to the transmission risk. Owners wishing to have their horses vaccinated against African Horse Sickness in the Free and Surveillance zones of Western Cape for competition purposes outside the 2 zones, must contact the state vet in the Western Cape for permission to vaccinate.**

As per 24th June 2025 SAEF AHS Directive: Check SAEF for any updates as they are closely monitoring the situation.

FEI REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS (FEI GENERAL REGULATIONS ART. 137)

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI for the current year.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

FEI REGULATIONS ON EQUINE INFLUENZA (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ART. 1003)

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

PASSPORTS: All horses must be in possession of their FEI Passports or SAEF Group IX Passports at all shows. Inspections, sampling, and random passport checks may take place at any event.

'EQUINE TESTING

All horses or ponies competing at SASJ and/or FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses or ponies may be selected for sampling in accordance with the obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures.

MCP testing as per SAEF Regulations will be done by the appointed Testing Vet.

Laboratory: National Horse Racing Authority, Turffontein Racecourse, Turf Club Street.

FEI testing will be as per FEI regulations by an appointed FEI Testing vet and sent to the FEI Appointed Laboratory.

Full information in the FEI and/or SAEF Veterinary Regulations

HUMAN ANTI DOPING

All Athletes can be tested at any FEI/and or SASJ event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organizations with Testing Jurisdiction.

Full information can be found The ADRHA(Anti-Doping Rules for Human Athletes) rules are published on the FEI's website at <http://inside.fei.org/content/anti-doping-rules>, and South African Drug Free Sport and WADA.

RESTRICTIONS: A horse may only compete in One class per day (National) and 2 classes per day (Provincial) with a maximum of 3 classes at the event for CSN classes.
Should your entry be deleted for non-payment, the entry will not be restored based on when it was initially done but will be based on when it was paid for. If the arenas are full, it will be added to the waiting list.
Horses may only compete in ONE Championship at the event.

SUBSTITUTIONS: A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider, not both. For National classes a substitution of a horse may only take place ONCE, before the horse inspection.
Should there be NO horse inspection, a substitution of a horse may only take place ONCE, by midday on the day before the National classes start, therefore NO substitutions of horses will be permitted.
Substitution of rider is permitted. All Substitutions must be given to the Show Holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties.
For Provincial Events a Substitution form must be correctly completed 30 minutes before the start of the class.

COMPETITION CLASSES	<i>All classes will be run under the applicable FEI Rule unless otherwise stated in the SASJ Annexures.</i>
HORSE VACCINATIONS	<i>It is the Athlete/Owners responsibility to ensure that they comply with the control measures of AHS and EQUINE FLU as per SAEF Regulations and are in the horses' passports which must always accompany the horse/pony</i>
MICROCHIP NO's	<i>Microchip numbers must be in the horses passport and SASJ Online System</i>
LIABILITY	<i>The FEI, SASJ, SAEF, The OC/SHB, Venue, Officials and sponsors shall in no way be held responsible for any damage, loss, theft, or injury sustained by owners, riders, competitors, horses, members or the public or any other person or their property whatsoever. E&OE</i>
CHANGES TO CLASSES	<i>The organising committee in consultation with the SASJ Representative reserve the right to combine, handicap, divide or cancel classes should this be necessary, always provided such amendments are not in conflict with the rules. Where necessary, classes may be restricted to qualifications. 80% of entry fees will be refunded should the class/s be cancelled due to inclement weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.</i>

	<p><i>The organising committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, limit, or divide classes or change arenas. Lower grade/provincial entries may be restricted, or classes cancelled, depending on number of entries. Recommended rounds per day will be in consultation with the President of the Ground Jury and SASJ Rep.</i></p> <p><i>Any classes that are combined will be on a handicap basis. Changes made at/during the show will be at the SHB's discretion in consultation with the Ground Jury. This also applies to adverse weather conditions. Entry Fees will not be refunded to any competitor in the event of any competition being changed to a different time, day, or different arena.</i></p> <p><i>The onus is on the rider to ensure their contact details are correct on the SASJ Database to receive any emails, and to check the SASJ Website for any changes to the schedule/programme. Any changes made to the programme once the final programme is published will be published on the SASJ website www.sashowjumping.co.za or sent out via newflash.</i></p>
ATHLETES	<i>Athletes are to be registered with a Club, SAEF and SASJ as per Annexures on the SASJ Database.</i>
HORSES/PONIES	<i>Horses/Ponies need to be registered with SASJ as per SASJ Annexures on the SASJ Database</i>
ELECTRONIC TIMING	<i>SASJ National FDS/Vola Timing Equipment – is required for all National and FEI Events and is the responsibility of the OC in conjunction with the timekeeper to organize, collect and return the equipment.</i>
STALLIONS	<i>All stallions should have a yellow disc on both sides of the bridle or have a yellow ribbon in the tail.</i>
ADVERTISING SPONSORS – ATHLETES & HORSES	<i>Athletes are to ensure that any sponsored Saddlecloths or Athlete Wear they compete in during the event – that the Sponsors are registered with SASJ for the current year and sizes of logos are in accordance with articles 256.3 and 257.3 of the FEI Jumping Rules The Chief Steward will check that the advertising on athletes and horses comply with these articles.</i>
GROOMS	<i>Riders are requested to provide sleeping accommodation for their grooms as there are no facilities for this purpose. There are electricity outlets at the stable area. Water is precious – please be aware of water wastage and help us to conserve water where possible</i>

PERC GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL DISCIPLINES

1. Payments are due on the closing date. The policy of "No Pay, no Ride" will be strictly enforced.
EFT reference: "NAME & SURNAME OF RIDER" e.g. Joy Smith
2. No horse may enter the show without a horse flu vaccination and AHS, please complete details (date & batch number) on entry form.
3. PAYMENT METHODS - EFT is preferred, if the payment is made via card / cash deposit or any other method that results in bank charges, these will be billed to the customer.
4. No refunds/credits will be made in respect of scratchings after closing date of entries.
5. Times will be up on the notice board 24 hours prior to the commencement of a show, and the final programme will be emailed to all members of the PERC. Non-Members may send the club secretary an email requesting the programme. No times will be given over the phone.
6. Please note that the only time that is exact is the starting time for the day, all other events will run on.
7. Insofar as possible, the program and conditions relating thereto will be adhered to. However, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to make alterations in the event of unfavourable weather conditions or any other unforeseen circumstances. The Organizing Committee further reserves the right to combine, vary, divide or cancel classes if insufficient entries are received. Depending on entries classes may be combined and/or handicapped and separate prizes will not be awarded. The show holding body of the PERC reserves the right to limit entries, depending on the total number of entries received per class.

8. Should the show be cancelled for any reason only 50% of entry fees will be refunded. No entries will be refunded if the show is postponed.
9. The SAEF, DSA, SASA, SAEQA, SASJ, ESA and the Port Elizabeth Riding Club, including their staff , organizers , committee members and all officials appointed by them , shall in no way be held responsible for any damage, loss or injury sustained to or by owners, competitors, grooms, horses , members of the public or any other person or persons or their property at the PE Riding Club for the duration of show. By entering this show you hereby indemnify them from any and all claims in connection with your participation in the show.
10. Please note that all PERC arenas are out of bounds at all times except during shows.
11. All horses / ponies that are prone to kicking must wear a red ribbon on their tails
12. No fires are allowed anywhere on the premises at any time except in the designated braai area
13. By entering a stallion at PERC, the owner and rider accept full responsibility and must hold public liability cover. Stallions must be securely stabled and may only be handled by a responsible rider or handler. Covering of mares is strictly prohibited. Stallions must wear a yellow bridle tag at all times.
14. All dogs must be on leashes during equestrian shows - off-leash dogs will incur a R300 fine. Owners must clean up after their dogs.
15. Competitors are expected to be respectful and co-operating with the medical staff. Failure in this regard may result in a penalty.
16. PERC ground staff will close all perimeter gates as well as the gates of the stable block at the end of each show day. PERC will not accept responsibility nor liability for any gates that are thereafter left open by riders, owners or grooms. No temporary paddocks are permitted.
17. It is the responsibility of all competitors to ensure they and their horses are correctly registered with all National and Provincial bodies. All FEI and SAEF rules shall apply.
18. Only club-approved official photographers may sell images at events. Commercial photography without prior permission is prohibited. Competitors may opt out of being photographed by notifying the secretary in writing before the event. Personal photography is allowed if non-disruptive.
19. Horses staying after the show's conclusion are at the owner's sole risk. Stables must be secured, and the Show Secretary must be notified in writing.

SECTION 9 SASJ RISING STAR SERIES

1. THE SERIES

The SA Show Jumping Rising Star Series is a series in South Africa for our top and upcoming Pony Riders, Juniors and Young Riders.

For a Organising committee wishing to apply to host the series, the following conditions apply:

- No leg of the series may be combined with an SA Championship or any of its qualifying classes.
- Each leg of the series should have an event built around it, with the Rising Star Classes being the most prominent.
- Each leg may not be allocated as a qualifier at an event with an Adult, Junior or Pony Rider series or Championship.
- The series legs will carry CSN1* status.

2. QUALIFICATION OF RIDERS

2.1 Rising Star Category 1.

The Series is a special class restricted to riders from the beginning of year they turn fourteen years of age to the end of the year they turn twenty-five.

2.2 Rising Star Category 2.

The Series is a special class restricted to riders from the beginning of year they turn twelve years of age to the end of the year they turn eighteen.

2.3 Rising Star Category 3.

The Series is a special class restricted to riders competing on ponies up to the end of the year the rider turns sixteen.

3. QUALIFICATION OF HORSES

Open to all horses/Ponies from the age of seven.

4. PRELIMINARY COMPETITIONS PRIOR TO EACH SERIES COMPETITION

At each event, the Organising Committee shall include in the schedule at least one preliminary competition for Open horses/Ponies.

5. ORDER OF STARTING

- 5.1 The order of starting in all the legs of the competitions shall be drawn.
- 5.2 Where possible, a gap of at least ten horses shall be allowed between horses ridden by the same rider. This shall be achieved by moving that rider's first horse drawn upwards in the order of riding.
- 5.3 Should a rider have more than one horse entered in any of the series competitions, then that rider shall declare in writing to the OC, prior to the commencement of the class, which horse will be going for the series points for that class. The declared horse/pony must be ridden first in all rounds of the competition. (Same as FEI World Cup Competitions)

6. RULES

6.1 Rising Star Category 1.

All series competitions will be run over Championship courses of National Standard (1,35m with four fences at 1.40m) run at a speed of 375 mpm.

Preliminary classes at each event will be run at a speed of 375mpm, or the speed of the relevant competitions at the show.

The qualifying rounds will be run under FEI Art 220.2.1. 2 (Old FEI Art 238.2.2.)

6.2 Rising Star Category 2.

All series competitions will be run over Championship courses of National Standard (1,30m with four fences at 1.35m) run at a speed of 375 mpm.

Preliminary classes at each event will be run at a speed of 375mpm, or the speed of the relevant competitions at the show.

The qualifying rounds will be run under FEI Art 220.2.1. 2 (Old FEI Art 238.2.2.)

6.3 Rising Star Category 3

All series competitions will be run over Championship courses of National Standard (1,10m with four fences at 1.15m) run at a speed of 350 mpm.

Preliminary classes at each event will be run at a speed of 350mpm, or the speed of the relevant competitions at the show.

The qualifying rounds will be run under FEI Art 220.2.1. 2 (Old FEI Art 238.2.2.)
