CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to always acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia, and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

Bought and Sold Entries will be allowed if the correct documentation is submitted within the correct time frames and the original rider has signed the form. There will be no buying and selling of entries after 25th June 2026. Forms received thereafter will not be accepted.

REFUNDS:

No Refunds will be given after closing date of entries. Entries withdrawn before close of date will be refunded less R50.00 bank charges. However, due to inclement weather conditions or

other unforeseen circumstances, should it necessitate cancelling a class or classes, 80% of the entry fee will be refunded.

Bank Details:

All entries to be paid for online via Payfast. Unpaid entries will be automatically deleted and will not be restored should arenas be full.

ENTRY FEE:

Composite Entry Fee: **R1200.00 per rider per height (2 Classes – JR 1.30m & 1.35m & PR 1.10m)**, which includes R85 per class SASJ Levy, R100 arena fee per class, R6.50 EDS Levy per class. R50 medical & security levy per class. Incl. 15% VAT). R50 officials levy per class, excl. VAT.

All Other Classes: R1700.00 Composite fee (3 classes) which includes R65 per class SASJ Levy, R100 DSC arena fee per class, R6.50 EDS Levy per class. R50 medical & security levy per class. Incl. 15% VAT). R50 officials levy per class, excl. VAT.

RESTRICTIONS:

In all Championship classes, a competitor may only ride 2 horses.

A horse may only compete in One class per day (National) and 2 classes per day (Provincial) with a maximum of 3 classes at the event.

Should your entry be deleted for non-payment, the entry will not be restored based on when it was initially done but will be based on when it was paid for thus if the arenas are full, it will be added to the waiting list.

NOMINATIONS:

Declarations for Open classes (JR 1.30m & 1.35m) taking place on the first day must be made online no later than 12h00 on Sunday, 28th June 2026

Riders who fail to make this declaration in time will automatically be entered in the same class as indicated on the SASJ Entry system.

YOU MAY NOT DO YOUR NOMINATIONS DURING HORSE INSPECTION.

Declarations will close 30 min after the end of the last open class on each day.

Riders who fail to make this declaration in time will automatically be entered in the same class as indicated on the SASJ entry system

STARTING FEES:

Starting fees are:

R600 – Junior 1.35m SA Championship:

R600 – Pony Rider 1.10m SA Championship:

R600 – Junior 1.30m Championship:

R500 – Pony Rider Consolation Championship

In all the Championship classes, a competitor may only ride 2 horses.

Note: Starting fees may not be deducted from prize money already won at the Event.

QUALIFICATIONS:

As per 2026 SASJ SA Individual Championships Rules - See attachment

1. Qualification points will be awarded as per SASJ Section 1 SA Champs Rules.
2. NOTE: Other placings, eliminations, retirements, and non-starters will not receive points. Horses that tie for a place will each receive the same number of points. Championship classes will be restricted to the leading 30 competitors in the qualifying classes based on the above points system. Riders may not ride more than two horses/ponies per championship.

PR1.10m, JNR 1.30m & JNR 1.35m may nominate between the 2 levels, the qualification points will be as follows: 1st=50, 2nd=47, 3rd=45, 4th=44, and continues down to 1 point, all eliminations & retirements will receive NO points.

Horses not qualified for the 2026 SA Junior Championship may compete in the Junior 1.30m Championship. Ponies not qualified for the 2026 SA Pony Rider Championship may compete in the Consolation Championship with a starting fee.

VICTOR LUDORUM: Qualification as per SASJ rule for Victor Ludorum prizes will be handed out for each grade and will be calculated as follows: 1st = 10 points, 2nd = 9 points, 3rd = 8 points, etc. Should there be a tie for 1st place, the Athlete with the higher placing in the Championship class will be declared the winner.

PRIZE MONEY: A minimum of 60% net of entry fees less levies and VAT for CSN classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies and VAT Provincial classes plus sponsorship per class. This excludes sponsorship money that will be independently allocated by the OC. **All CSN Jumping classes will be subject to a 15% deduction from prize money to be paid into the SASJ Riders Fund.**

SUBSTITUTIONS: A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider.
For provincial classes with Composite entry fee, should a horse need to be substituted it may be substituted ONCE per entry only (if a composite entry of 3 classes, only ONE change may be done). Should a rider be substituted and the entry consists of a composite entry of 3 classes, the rider may be changed more than once. All substitutions must be given to the show holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties, a minimum of 30 minutes before the start of the relevant class. For National classes a substitution may only take place ONCE, before the horse inspection. Should there be NO horse inspection, a substitution may only take place ONCE, by midday on the day before the National classes start, thereafter, and NO substitutions will be permitted. All substitutions must be given to the Show Holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties.

DRESS: Jackets Only

STABLING: Stabling is booked on a single online platform to ensure all disciplines have equal opportunity to book stables. Stables will be secure once booked and paid for via **PayFast** and completing all necessary information by using the link <https://bookings.shongweniclub.co.za>

Stable requests will be given consideration but please understand that we are not able to meet all stabling requests. Use of stables not allocated and paid for prior to the show by ANY competitor, horse or owner, will result in the rider being fined and/or disqualified from the show. If stables are oversubscribed, preference and allocation will be given to out of province riders first, regardless of payment thereof. Please note that no other stabling form will be accepted as a booking. All bookings must be made through the online platform.

Permanent Stables = R2200 Duration of Show

Temporary Stables = R1900 Duration of the Show

Initial bedding is included. Additional bedding will be available for purchase at the club office for R65 per bag.

NO PADDOCKS ALLOWED AT ALL

The grooms are encouraged to hand walk horses.

GROOMS MEALS: To be purchased at the kiosk.

ACCESS: **Free Access**
All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

PASSPORTS:

All horses & Ponies must be in possession of their FEI Passports or Group IX Passports at all shows. Inspections, sampling and random passport checks, may take place at any event. All horses competing must be registered with SASJ and SAEF for the year 2026

SAMPLING (SAEF & FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS):

'EQUINE TESTING

All horses or ponies competing at SASJ and/or FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses or ponies may be selected for sampling in accordance with the obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures.

MCP testing as per SAEF Regulations will be done by the appointed Testing Vet.

Laboratory: National Horse Racing Authority, Turffontein Racecourse, Turf Club Street.

FEI testing will be as per FEI regulations by an appointed FEI Testing vet and sent to the FEI Appointed Laboratory.

HUMAN ANTI DOPING

All Athletes can be tested at any FEI/and or SASJ event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organizations with Testing Jurisdiction.

SOUTH AFRICAN EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS, EQUINE INFLUENZA & AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS.

HORSES' ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE – SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS Article 1001 – Equine Identification

Horses or Ponies that do not have FEI Passports must have a SAEF Group IX Passport to compete in South Africa.

1. Person Responsible (PRs) must comply with the requirements for national and SAEF Passports, Recognition Cards and registration for Events as described in the General Regulations.

EQUINE INFLUENZA

UPDATE UPDATED DIRECTIVE 07032026 – DISPENSATION INFLUENZA (FLU) VACCINATION

The SAEF Executive have agreed to the following dispensation **which** will come into effect from the **1st April 2026**, and remain in effect unless rescinded by the SAEF, due to an outbreak of Equine Influenza in the country or other circumstances that may occur requiring more frequent vaccination.

All horses born after the 1st January 2020, or horses that have not previously received vaccination will be required to demonstrate the administration of the Primary Equine Influenza Course of V1, V2 and V3 as set out in the SAEF/FEI Veterinary Regulations as per the rules prior to 1st January 2024, or as per the rules from the 1st January 2024.

All vaccinations must be administered by a Veterinarian and entered, signed and stamped by the administering Veterinarian in the horses passport. **Following the Primary course, horses will be required to be vaccinated once a year. You may not exceed 365 days in a normal year or 366 days in a leap year.** However, if a calendar year is exceeded between annual vaccination, the Primary Course will have to be repeated. **No vaccination may be administered in the 7 days preceding any event that the horse may be entered into, or attend a measuring session..**

All horses born prior to 1st January 2020, must demonstrate a minimum of 6 annual vaccinations, with an interval not exceeding 1 year between vaccinations, and administered by a registered veterinarian to avoid having to complete the Primary Course. If a year was exceeded between 2019 and 2020, a Primary vaccination is required.

*****VERY IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO FEI RIDERS - FEI HORSES ARE NOT EXEMPTED *****

Please note: Horses registered with the FEI and competing in FEI events are not exempt from vaccination under this dispensation. **All FEI registered horses MUST be vaccinated by a REGISTERED veterinarian with Equine Influenza vaccine within 6 months and 21 days of competition.**

All horses must have had a PRIMARY Course of Equine Influenza (Only Exception are horses that have been vaccinated every year without a primary course since 2005)

VACCINE 1 (V1)

First Vaccine of the Primary Course. Horse is Not eligible to compete.

VACCINE 2 (V2)

First Booster. Administered between 21 – 60 days after V1.

(prior to January 2024 = 21 – 92 days)

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VACCINE 3 (V3)

Horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days.

Second Booster of the PRIMARY Course administered WITHIN 6 months after V2.

(Prior to January 2024 within 7 months of V2) these horses vaccinated prior to January 1

January

2024, according to the protocol in place at the time, are no required to redo their primary Vaccinations)

NB: NO HORSE MAY COMPETE FOR 7 DAYS FOLLOWING ANY VACCINATION

All horses must have their Equine Influenza Primary Course Vaccinations recorded in their latest FEI Group IX Passport by 30th April 2024. If a horses passport is found upon inspection, to not have the Equine Influenza Primary Course Vaccination recorded, the horse will not be eligible to compete in a competition. Please note below the wording to be used by the veterinarian, for the vaccination history to be transferred to the latest FEI Group IX Passport:

The vaccination history and primary course of this horse is correct to date in accordance with the FEI Veterinary Regulations. Last Vaccination on 00/00/00 date > Must be signed, stamped and dated by the veterinarian.

The last vaccination in the previous passport must be transcribed into the new passport by the veterinarian

AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS (AHS)

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa, and as such the State Veterinary Department must be notified of any positive cases. According to the Government "Animal Diseases Act 35 of 1984" all Equidae must be vaccinated against AHS annually, (except in the controlled AHS Zones of the Western Cape)

The only vaccine currently registered in terms of Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act no 36 of 47) for AHS and therefore the only efficient/effective remedy "as described above is the live virus vaccine produced by Onderstepoort Biological Products (OBP).

For Competition purposes the following apply:

- i) As per the directive issued on the 8th August 2024, for competition purposes in the AHS infected zone, horses must have received at least ONE AHS Bottle 1 and one AHS bottle 2 vaccine between 1 June 2022 and 1 December 2025
- ii) From 1 December 2025 for competition purposes in the AHS infected zone, horses must have received at least one AHS 1 and one AHS 2 vaccine in a calendar year. (i.e. between 1 January and 31st December each year)
- iii) Horses residing in the AHS Controlled area within the AHS free and surveillance zones of the Cape do not require AHS vaccination in order to compete. However, should these horses leave the AHS controlled area, they will require vaccination against AHS as described in i) and ii) above.
For movement into the AHS controlled area of the Western Cape, a horse must have received its AHS vaccinations within 24 months of entry. Any changes to this requirement will be communicated by DALRRD and is outside the administrative control of SAEF.
- iv) Horse residing within the AHS protection zone require AHS vaccination in order to compete both within the AHS controlled area and, within the AHS infected zone as described in i) and ii).
- v) The only accepted registered vaccine for competition purposes is the Onderstepoort Biological Products vaccine, as it is currently the only registered vaccine against AHS in terms of the "Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act 36 of 47)
- vi) AHS vaccines must be supplied and administered by a registered veterinarian, who is required to sign and stamp the passport as part of the vaccination certification.
- vii) The current AHS vaccine is an attenuated live vaccine supplied in 2 bottles AHS1 and AHS2. The two vaccine bottles must be administered at least 3 (three) weeks apart. If vaccines are given less than 3 weeks apart, both vaccines are invalidated, making the horse ineligible to compete and compromising its welfare.
Research has shown that leaving a longer interval between vaccines is better for producing greater immunity.
- viii) In the AHS infected zone, it is strongly recommended that horses are not vaccinated during periods of high midge prevalence due to the risk of vaccine virus transmission by the midge vector.
- ix) **AHS vaccination is only allowed in the AHS controlled area between 1st June and 31st October each year due to the transmission risk. Owners wishing to have their horses vaccinated against African Horse Sickness in the Free and Surveillance zones of Western Cape for competition purposes outside the 2 zones, must contact the state vet in the Western Cape for permission to vaccinate.**
As per 24th June 2025 SAEF AHS Directive: Check SAEF for any updates as they are closely monitoring the situation.

FEI REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS (FEI GENERAL REGULATIONS ART. 137)

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI for the current year.
FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

FEI REGULATIONS ON EQUINE INFLUENZA (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ART. 1003)

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

FINES IN RESPECT OF PASSPORT VIOLATIONS

Refer to SAEF General and Veterinary Regulations

COMPETITORS WILL BE FINED FOR ANY ERRORS AND/OR OMISSIONS IN THEIR HORSES PASSPORTS

MEDICATION CONTROL:

MCP testing as per SAEF Regulations will be done by the appointed Testing Vet.

Laboratory: National Horse Racing Authority, Turffontein Racecourse, Turf Club Street.

PROTESTS & APPEALS: As per SAEF General Regulations. All protests and Objections must be done in writing within the required timelines and in receipt of a deposit of the relevant fee.

HORSE INSPECTION:

Sunday 28th June 2026 @ 1pm – 2:30pm

ALL Pony Rider 1.10/1.15m Ponies and Junior 1.30m & 1.35m Horses as well as open team horses and ponies.

Any horses intending to do these classes must attend the horse inspection.

Times may be revised after the closing date of entries.

MICROCHIP NO's	<i>Microchip numbers must be in the horses passport and SASJ Online System</i>
LIABILITY	<i>The FEI, SASJ, SAEF, The OC/SHB, Venue, Officials and sponsors shall in no way be held responsible for any damage, loss, theft, or injury sustained by owners, riders, competitors, horses, members or the public or any other person or their property whatsoever. E&OE</i>

CHANGES TO CLASSES	<p><i>The organising committee in consultation with the SASJ Representative reserve the right to combine, handicap, divide or cancel classes should this be necessary, always provided such amendments are not in conflict with the rules. Where necessary, classes may be restricted to qualifications. 80% of entry fees will be refunded should the class/s be cancelled due to inclement weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.</i></p> <p><i>The organising committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, limit, or divide classes or change arenas. Lower grade/provincial entries may be restricted, or classes cancelled, depending on number of entries.</i></p> <p><i>Any classes that are combined will be on a handicap basis. Changes made at/during the show will be at the SHB's discretion in consultation with the Ground Jury. This also applies to adverse weather conditions. Team nominations, on the prescribed forms, must be completed and received by the Show Secretary (copy to SAEF & SASJ) **by 15th June 2026 at 16h00**. Each Province or National Federation may only enter one team. All team entries must be entered in the **individual** classes for the discipline concerned.

For all other teams, the Team Managers must submit to the Show Secretary their final team selection from those nominated not later than 15:00 or such later time as the discipline Representative shall determine on the day preceding the start of the Team Championship concerned.

The draw for Team Championships will be done the day before each Championship at a time to be declared by the OC.

The rules governing the substitution of team horses and/or riders are laid down in in the relevant discipline rules and General Regulations. Should two or more Provincial Bodies be unable to compete in the National Team Championship in any discipline due to lack of competitors/horses of the required standard, then those Provincial Bodies may combine to send one team.

This team shall in all respects be deemed to be a team entered by a Province. **All team Athletes and Horses should be entered in the show and the onus is on the rider and province concerned to ensure that team entries are done prior to the closing date of entries or arenas filling up.**
