

Team Numbers (and composition) for Team Competitions per Federation and Chef d'Equips.	Only 1 team of a maximum of 4 athletes (minimum 3) will be permitted per National Federation per Discipline (Jumping and Dressage). A team may be made up of Children (eligible to ride horses), Young Riders, Juniors and/or Adults but not more than two athletes may ride at ANY ONE level. (See further Rules under each discipline Team Competition.) A Chef d Equipe from each Nation should accompany each team for Show Jumping and Dressage. The designated Chef d'Equipe of the team MUST nominate and declare each NF's team by one hour before the published time for the draw of each competition. Refunds will be given to those not eligible for the Speed competition.
Guest NF's	The host Nation Organising Committee may be able to assist with horses. The horses will be leased on a first come first serve basis and limited per NF. (For fees contact Jumping delegate: Ute Gebhardt at +264 81 128 2935 or jumping@namef.org.na .) Riders from Guest NF's on leased or lent horses may compete at one grade lower than the horse's recorded grade. Riders on own horses may only compete in their current recorded grade and higher in all Speed competitions. All visiting NF Athletes must produce proof of a horse's Grade from their member NFs.
Protests	All protests must be done in writing and be accompanied by a cash deposit of NAD 1500.00 and according to FEI Rules. (Article 163). Appeals committee: to be confirmed by Thursday 10 th May, posted at show office.

All competitions will be run under FEI Rules except as noted. In Classes 2, 5 and 8, FEI WCH-S Rules will also apply. In Class 12 special Inter-Africa Rules as below. Horses (or ponies registered as horses) must be 6 years old or over to participate.

In Classes 1, 4, 7,10: Horses are permitted to enter one grade lower than their recorded grade but if not eligible will be considered as Hors Concours(HC) entries and will not receive prizes. **ONLY ONE ENTRY PER HORSE.**

In Classes 3,6,9,11: Competitors may only compete in their recognized level or higher. If entered one grade lower than their recorded grade the combination will be considered HC entries and will not receive prizes. ONLY ONE ENTRY PER HORSE. POST ENTRIES PERMITTED AFTER TEAM DECLARATION ON SATURDAY EVENING.

Class 2 will be recorded for possible Qualification for FEI World Jumping Challenge Finals.

Classes 2 and 5 will be recorded for possible Qualification to Africa Youth Games 2018 for eligible athletes.

Classes 2, 5 and 8 An athlete choosing to drop a level after the first round in Category A or B MAY be permitted to do so, but will not qualify for recording or for a FEI WJC ranking.

Classes 2, 5 and 8 will be awarded Inter-Africa prizes for their scores which will be considered as the Inter-Africa Individual Championships. Scores of eligible Athletes will be forwarded to the FEI to be included in the appropriate ranking for the FEI WJC.

Special Rules for Class 12 Adjusted for Inter-Africa Nations Cup:

- 1. Teams will be declared by the Chef d'Equipe and consist of 4 athletes not more than 2 athletes per level with a drop score **OR** 3 athletes without drop score not more than 2 athletes per level.
- 2. Eliminations / retirements will be given a score including a penalty of 16 more penalties than the highest penalties recorded by any other athlete in that round.
- 3. Reliminations / retirements in round one are eligible to compete in round 2 subject to

Medical / Veterinary approval if necessary.

4. In case of an equality of penalties of teams after the two rounds, ONE rider will be nominated per team by the Chef d'Equip to jump off against the clock to determine the medal placing. If after the jump off, the penalties and times are still equal, there will be NO further Jump Offs and a tie (ex equo) for that Medal place declared.

SPECIAL RULES FOR SCORING OF INDIVIDUAL AND TEAM COMPETITIONS.

Individual Competitions: will be scored and placed as normal with the Athlete / Horse receiving the highest percentage declared the winner. 2nd highest second and so forth.

INTER- AFRICA INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIP:

Percentage Scores for the TWO tests in each of the 4 levels (Novice, Elementary, Elementary Medium and Medium) will be added together and divided by two. The Athlete / Horse with the highest average percentage of both tests IN EACH LEVEL will be declared the Inter Africa Gold medal winner for that level. The 2nd highest average will be the Silver Medallist and the 3rd highest will be the Bronze Medallist.

INTER- AFRICA DRESSAGE NATIONS CUP:

- 1. Teams will be declared by the Chef d'Equip and consist of 4 athletes not more than <u>2</u> athlete per level with a drop score **OR** 3 athletes without drop score not more than 1 athlete per level.
- 2. The SECOND test in each level (Classes 14, 16, 18 and 20) held on Saturday will determine the Team Score. The percentages of each team member will be added together (dropping the lowest score in the case of a team of four Athletes) and divided by three.
- 3. The Team with the highest average percentage will be declared the Inter-Africa Dressage Nations Cup Winner. The team with the 2^{nd} highest average percentage second and so forth.
- 4. In case of an equality of percentages of two or more teams, a tie (ex equo) will be declared for whichever places are tied by their scores.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
